It is my pleasure to present the Annual Report to members of the Mt Eliza Men's Shed for the financial year 2019–2020.

It has been an extraordinary year as our community has grappled with the COVID-19 pandemic. Our shed closed its doors in May (as did other sheds around the country). We are only now seeing restrictions ease. The lockdown has had an enormous impact on all of us and we will be recovering from the economic effects of it for the foreseeable future. As the pandemic took hold in March, the committee focused on the health and safety of our members. We were acutely aware that our members fall into at-risk groups, and our priority was to keep our members safe.

It was fantastic to see our shed members stay in touch and check-in with each other during the lockdown. Congratulations to all of you who were there for each other and helped your mates through the difficult time. My thanks to our Secretary Pat Davenport for being a conduit for information and connection.

I would like to thank our loyal team of shed members. You are the lifeblood of our organisation and we're here because of you. As we emerge from the pandemic, it will be your passion and commitment to the Mount Eliza Men's Shed that will pull us back together again. We've been isolated and disorientated by the pandemic, but I know our shedders are a resilient group who will roll-up their sleeves and get on with the task of re-building and reconnecting.

Many members remained busy during the lockdown and worked on projects by themselves at home. I've enjoyed seeing the results. It's clear our members have considerable talent and skills. Visit our website at <u>www.mountelizamensshed.org</u> to see more of the work our members have been doing.

Thank you to my fellow committee members. Our volunteer committee is made up of shed members and representatives from our key community stakeholders (Mount Eliza's Lions Club, Rotary Club and Bendigo Bank's Community Bank). Despite the COVID-19 lockdown the committee continued to meet via Zoom to keep the administration of the shed rolling along. Thanks to Ian Davey, who has taken care of our accounts as Treasurer and to the support I've had personally from Linda Morris and Pat Davenport. I thank all the committee members for their hard work (so much of it unseen) and dedication to the Mount Eliza Men's Shed.

A focus of our work this year has been to secure our tenure on a site at the Mount Eliza Secondary College (located on Mount Eliza Way). This is where we are planning to construct our new shed. The Secondary College itself is supportive of us building on a parcel of land on their grounds. During the year we established a sub-committee to complete the paperwork required by the Victorian Department of Education and Training. That paperwork (and there was a lot of it) was submitted to the department in August. We eagerly await the decision. My thanks to committee members John McCarthy and Alex Godfrey who were instrumental in the process; also to Brenda Baker and Marcia Claringbold at the Mount Eliza Secondary College who supported us through it.

Once we have the department's approval we can begin fundraising and construction of our new shed. Our community partners are poised to help us with fundraising activities and grant applications. There are a number of local, state and federal grants available to us and work to be done to apply for them. In terms of construction, we'll need to get final quotes and specifications nailed down.

Meanwhile, we continue to build our relationship with the Secondary College. Some of our members are helping the college maintenance manager on a greenhouse project. We've also continued to have a close relationship with the Mount Eliza Chamber of Commerce. The chamber is always in need of extra manpower to help with their community events and activities. While we're planning for the new shed these community engagement activities are keeping our members busy and connected.

There is plenty of work to do in 2021. It's going to be a very exciting year for the Mount Eliza Men's Shed as we move forward with our plans. I thank you all for your patience as we're working through the lengthy process of securing permission for use of the site. The COVID-19 pandemic has not made things any easier this year. I'm looking forward to a very bright future for the Mount Eliza Men's Shed. I know we have a passionate and committed team working to ensure it, and there is a great deal of goodwill in our community for the shed.

Notes to the Financial Statements

Mount Eliza Men's Shed Inc. For the year ended 30 June 2020

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Incorporated Associations Reform Act 2012 (Victoria) The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.
